Sung by the performers as part of **a world**, **a world**, a dance that after a 2-year hiatus will premiere in its final form in January, they point towards the kind of energy-charged relationship between artists and audience that we strive for.

Singing together, dancing together, and developing material together is a privilege and a joy. It is an equally potent joy to share the uniqueness and fierceness of what arises and is shaped in the studio with you, with everyone. And, while still dwelling happiily in the grass-roots intimacy that is both necessary and valued, we at Performance Works NW plan to continue to imbue all our work in the next year and decade with our unique brand of fierce inclusivity.

Since 2000—for close on 20 years!—PWNW has thrived as a site for transformative experimentation. Initiatives such as the Alembic Resident Artist Program and Alembic Co-Productions, plus our subsidized space rental have evolved as responses to this question: "How can we best foster the process of artists and the meeting of artists with audience?" In 2019, in addition to the 2500-3000 hours of research and rehearsal time, this is what happened: 47 performances of 17 individual productions!

- **—PWNW Public Access:** 7 individual productions, 16 total performances by Experience Cult, Jana Zahler, Beth Whelan & Trevor Wilde, Kelly Koltiska & Amelia Unsicker and more!
